

February 2014 Minutes

The February meeting was called to order at 7:32 p.m. and adjourned at 8:05 p.m. Clark Robeson, our treasurer, was not in attendance so Amber Brush reported the current balance as \$4,111.14.

Jeremy Schaffer was not in attendance so Amber Brush gave the activities report. Sunday, February 16th is the annual chili cook off. It will be held at the Millard Legion Hall at 1:00 p.m. This is the same location as last year. Amber asked that members report what they planned to bring so she can designate needed items to those who don't have a preference of what they bring. A sign up sheet was passed around the room.

Amber Brush reported old business as the auto show members attended at the Century Link on January 23rd. Amber thanked those who attended, not only this year, but previous years also for continuing to make a good impression as it has reflected very well of the club. This has ensured that the club continues to get invited back every year for a private tour.

Amber reported new business to be the second annual Paul Brown memorial rally that will be held on August 2nd. This year the rally will start in Carroll, IA and end in Lincoln. Tracey and Jodi Wellendorf are sponsoring the rally. There are a total of 25 rooms blocked off at the Carrolton Inn and Super 8 East. This will be the 13th year the club has hosted a track event. Dan would like to invite members to participate to try and better the event.
